Hossein Martin Fazeli, has been writing and directing dramatic and non-fiction films for the past 15 years. His films have been broadcast around the world, including on CNN, BBC, ARTE, SBS, and Canal+. His film, *The Tale of The Two Nazanins*, about an Iranian teenage girl imprisoned on death row, was broadcast on CNN and BBC and is credited with igniting an international campaign that saved her life. His most recently completed documentary, *Women on The Frontline*, is about the women's freedom movement in Iran.

He was short-listed by the Sundance Institute to take part in their International Filmmakers Award. His films have won 37 international awards.



Jack Silberman

Producer

Jack Silberman studied documentary film production at MIT and has a master's degree from Harvard. He has produced, directed, and written more than 40 documentaries for Canadian, American (PBS), British (Channel 4), French (ARTE), and Japanese (NHK) television networks, as well as for the National Film Board of Canada, National Geographic, Discovery Channel, and others. His film, *Island of Whales*, was narrated by Gregory Peck, broadcast on PBS, and won 17 awards, including the Gemini award for best documentary. *Bombies* was also broadcast on PBS and won First Place awards at a dozen film festivals, including San Francisco, Chicago, and the Japan Prize. He has extensive international experience, having worked on location in many different countries. He also spent 6 years living in India and Sri Lanka. His films have won more than 60 international awards.

Gillian Greenfeld completed her MFA in documentary media at Ryerson University, did five years of undergraduate work in anthropology and film, and studied film at FAMU in the Czech Republic. She has extensive work experience in documentary films. She has directed and produced six of her own films, exploring issues of feminism and identity, which were widely screened.

Shernaz Italia has been in the world of film and television for almost 35 years. In 1980 she worked on Richard Attenborough's iconic film ``Gandhi`` and that experience set her on a course for a career in film which continues to the present day.

Nat Geo; Atlas - India Revealed Discovery; Kumbh Mela Nat Geo; Welcome to India BBC; Dispatches - Terror in Mumbai, Channel 4; Around the World in 80 days with Michael Palin BBC; The Great Moghuls with Bamba Gascoigne, Channel 4; Queen of the Elephants with Mark Shand for Discovery; Gordon Ramsey's Great Escape Channel 4; Several episode's of Human Planet and Human Universe for BBC to name but a few.
